# LEARN SHEFFIELD SUBSCRIPTION OVERVIEW

This booklet contains information about the subscription offer to Sheffield settings in 2022/23. It can also be found **online**, supplemented by recorded updates from our CEO Stephen Betts.

The offer has evolved for next year, with a wider range of packages available as well as a more detailed menu of options. This will enable colleagues to tailor the subscription to meet the needs of their setting.

Following the withdrawal of the DfE School Improvement Grant, and the decision of Schools' Forum to de-delegate funding to replace it, there will be modifications to the Sheffield City Council (SCC) School Improvement Commission in 2022/23. This is separate from this subscription but will be shared shortly so that colleagues can make decisions with a full understanding of the support that is likely to be available.

Similarly, the challenging funding position of SCC is likely to mean that there will not be new Funded Programmes or additional cohorts for existing programmes in 2022/23. Learn Sheffield is working with partners to adapt programmes so that Sheffield colleagues have the option of using their subscription to access Priority Programmes next year (see pages 12).

## **Key Information**

- The 2022-2023 subscription covers the second year of the existing contract.
- Settings continue to have an annual 'opt-out' (by informing Learn Sheffield before 30 June this has been extended due to the later launch of this offer) in their subscription contract and so have the ability to leave between years.
- The packages and pricing options for the subscription are outlined on the next page (p3). There are more packages available and each contains more than it did last year.
- The subscription map (p4-5) contains an overview of the menu of options for schools' to use their day credits. Further detail about the offer options follow on the subsequent pages (p6-11).
- Deployments conversations with schools will take place across the summer term and can be booked immediately.

# LEARN SHEFFIELD SUBSCRIPTION COSTINGS

The cost of the 2022/23 subscription is below.

The SCC commission will continue to include a contribution to the cost of the subscription for maintained schools next year, as it did in 2021/22. The level of this discount will be confirmed shortly but will be at least the £750 that it was last year.

The revised offer contains a range of packages, each containing the core offer plus a number of day credits which can be redeemed against the menu of options outlined on the next page.

Bespoke packages can be discussed and there is considerable flexibility to scope each subscription to meet the needs of each setting. Specific advice for MATs who wish to subscribe centrally will also be available shortly.

## **CORE OFFER SUMMARY**

The core offer contains elements in each of the four themes of the subscription: partner support, leadership & governance, curriculum development and evaluation & review. All subscribers, whichever package they have chosen, can access all of the core offer elements described below

## **Partner Support Core Offer**

This includes the **point of need support** (sometimes referred to as the 'bat phone'!) which has been such a key feature of the subscription for Sheffield settings.

It also includes a growing range of online support, training and guidance on both the Forge CPD platform and unlimited access to the Learn Sheffield website content. This content will continue to evolve so that content is accessed via a password but subscribing settings will have access to all of it.

Finally, the partner support core offer also includes access to the **Crisis Comms** service. This is delivered in partnership between Learn Sheffield and SCC to provide a wide range of support to settings when they need it.

## **Leadership & Governance Core Offer**

This includes both **Leader and Governance briefings** to ensure that both groups have access to a regular programme of briefings throughout the year.

There will also be a **Conference and Festival programme** which provides a different opportunity for setting leaders each term. This will include an online festival in the autumn and further online and face to face opportunities in the spring and summer.

The Governance training programme and annual conference continue to be included in the core offer along with the Leadership training programme, which will include specific content for new and aspiring leaders alongside refresher content for existing leaders.

Finally, the curriculum development core offer will include a **programme of Subject Networks** which will be delivered in partnership across Sheffield and Rotherham for the first time next year.

The School Improvement Partner package remains one of our most popular offers. It contains visits from an identified Improvement Partner to work alongside school leaders and provide skilled external eyes and a critical friend.

This package can be scoped according to the needs of your setting but, as an example, will use 2\* day credits for three (termly) half day visits with a note of visit each time. A package with three (termly) full days or six (half-termly) half days plus a note of visit each time will use 4\*day credits.

Many colleagues also use Learn Sheffield to provide an external advisor in their appraisal or performance management process.

Our standard package uses  $1^*$  day credit and this is extended to  $1.5^*$  day credits if the setting would also like a mid-year review.

Bespoke packages are also available, including supporting appraisal of CEOs or those in executive leadership positions.

All packages can be amended to meet the needs of your setting and each  $0.5^*$  or  $1^*$  day credit can be scoped and commissioned as a bespoke activity as it has been in previous years.

Colleagues can talk to us about this in the summer deployment conversations as before.

The Senior Leader Coaching package also uses 3\* credits but provides 1:1 support. The coach skillset and the choice of in-person or online is up to you.

A developmental governance review uses 3\* day credits to provide an extended deep dive into the impact of governance. A desktop evaluation is combined with a self-evaluation, interviews and meeting sampling to inform a written report and feedback to a meeting.

## Enhanced Pre-Ofsted Support

Onsite checks (including safeguarding), interviews and review to consider likely inspection trails alongside leaders.

We have two Pre-Ofsted support packages, both of which build on the Core Ofsted training available in the Core Offer.

Our 1\* day credit package provides a paperwork (desktop) review with feedback and a 'pre-inspection' call which simulates the real thing and is followed by feedback.

Our 3\* day credit package includes the above but extends it to also include a website review and report, an onsite safeguarding (half day) check, bespoke training for leaders and governors plus a one day (onsite) review of the Quality of Education to identify likely areas of focus in inspection.

## Whole School Developmental Review

Onsite whole school review alongside leaders with written report.

#### **Whole School Developmental Review**

- 2\* One person with report (1 day onsite)
- 3\* Two people (or one person for two days) onsite with report

We also offer a whole school developmental review which can be scoped according to the needs and size of the setting. When this is chosen to accompany the enhanced pre-Ofsted support this reduces the cost by  $1^*$  day credit (as the review replaces the one day review of Quality of Education).



## PRIORITY PROGRAMMES

As we described in the overview on page 2 of this booklet, the challenging funding context is likely to mean that SCC funding will not be available to support the Funded Programmes offer that many settings have accessed in 2021/22. At the time of publishing this booklet, Learn Sheffield is waiting for confirmation of this from SCC.

We are also working with partners to adapt existing programmes and develop new ones which can be offered to settings from 2022/23 onwards. This includes some of our existing programmes, for example:

- Curriculum Project led by Mary Myatt
- Teaching WalkThrus led by Tom Sherrington
- Making the Difference (for disadvantaged learners) led by Marc Rowland
- SEND Peer Networks led by David Bartram

These programmes will generally be funded by schools, academies and colleges and so will be adapted to ensure that the costs are realistic.

Some programmes will also be available through our growing partnership with ROSIS in Rotherham, enabling Sheffield settings to access programmes which have only previously been available to Rotherham schools.

Other existing partnerships will also provide options that Sheffield setting may wish to consider. Create Sheffield, for example, have introduced an enhanced offer – the <u>Creative Schools</u>
<u>Programme</u>.

Where possible we will also work with external funders to match fund with settings or reduce the cost to settings who choose to participate in these programmes.

An **initial range of Priority Programmes will be shared next half term** and then be added to as new opportunities become available.

Whilst the timing of when priority programmes become available may not always be conducive to Sheffield schools, academies and colleges being able to use their subscription day credits to partfund their access, settings will be able to use their day credits to cover some or all of the cost of priority programmes if they choose to.

## ADDITIONAL SERVICES

Learn Sheffield will continue to develop and offer a range of additional services.

Some of these services are included within the core offer in the subscription, for example **Crisis Comms** or the **Data Package**. They, like all aspects of the subscription, can be purchased as stand alone options by settings who do not subscribe.

There are also some services which are not included within the core subscription offer because their cost would unbalance the subscription for those settings who would not choose them otherwise. The best examples of these services are the **Governance Improvement (clerking and guidance) or GDPR services**.

The link between these services and the subscription package was ended in the current 2021/22 subscription offer, and these services are now purchased separately from the subscription.

This will continue to be the case in 2022/23. Settings which currently purchase these services will be contacted shortly about renewal but if colleagues are interested in enquiring about these services then they should contact us or mention this when discussing the subscription.
