



Learn Sheffield Subscription Offer 2018-2021 Year 3 (2020-2021)


Key Information

- For existing subscribers this will be the final year of a three-year subscription contract.
- The window to 'opt-out' for next year has been extended to close on Friday 17th July 2020.
- New subscribers will be given a one-year contract to bring them in to line with existing subscribers.

2020-21 Learn Sheffield Subscription

What does the subscription cost?

The cost of the subscription was set out last year in this diagram below. It will cost £1500 per school plus £5 per pupil in 2020/21 with the costs continuing to be capped at 750 pupils. The pupil numbers will be taken from census data, as they were last year. Each school/academy has the choice to either make a single payment (at the start of the year) or make three termly payments.



What does each school receive?

This year we have removed the bespoke menu column and included this content in the core offer. Each school will continue to receive the bespoke credit as part of their entitlement but it is built into the core offer. As previously the bespoke credit will equate to £850 (equivalent to 1.5 days of support) for Primary & Special Schools. Secondary schools continue to receive the equivalent of £1650 or 3 days of support.



We have also removed the 'universal offer' column as this content remains the same as it has previously and relates more to the SCC School Improvement Commission than it does to the subscription.

More detail of the offer is found on the next page but the key elements for each school to make choices about are:

- 2 days of LSIP support (Health Check days)
- 1 additional day of LSIP support if due Ofsted
- £850 credit (Primary/Special) or £1650 credit (Secondary) or the equivalent in additional days of support
- Whether to use the option of service discounts

As was the case last year, if a school wishes to subscribe but not access the 2 days of Health Check support they can continue to do this and reduce their subscription cost by £1100. Schools will also receive School Improvement Safety Net days following categorisation in the autumn term.

Each school will also continue to work with its partnership group (primary locality or sector partnership) to make choices about the partnership offer again this year.

Key Changes

What are the key changes from the 2019/20 subscription offer?

- The Universal Offer column has been removed. We don't anticipate any significant changes in the universal offer but have removed it from the subscription as it relates more to the SCC School Improvement Commission.
- We have also removed the Bespoke Menu and merged it in to the core offer. This is because this better reflects how it is discussed within the planning conversations with schools, where the additional credit is simply part of the discussion about entitlement and options.

Partnership Core Offer

- Learn Sheffield will continue to attend each partnership by agreement with schools leaders but this will not always be a named LSIP. This reflects the changes that have happened naturally over the past two years and is likely to reflect current arrangements next year.
- The partnership training offer has been extended and will now also include sessions relating to Digital Skills/ Blended Learning and RSHE. These sessions will often be twilights as they have been this year but can be arranged to suit the partnership.
- We will continue to provide an action plan budget for the final year of the current subscription and this will continue to be £5k per partnership and able to be accessed flexibly as funding or professional time.

School Improvement Core Offer

- Bespoke training for individual schools or groups has been added in to the core offer. Many schools have used LSIP time previously to design specific one-off sessions or programmes for middle or senior leaders.
- Priority training programmes have been added to the core offer this year. This will build on last year where programmes were designed to address priority areas (for example early reading and phonics or curriculum) and many schools used their subscription entitlement to access them.
- The data analysis school package will be reviewed in the light of the current situation and the bespoke options (previously within the bespoke menu) have been added in to the core offer.

Sheffield System Core Offer

- The School Improvement Safety Net (1-3 days of additional support allocated following categorisation through the Sheffield Gateway) remains but has moved in to the Sheffield System part of the core offer where it fits more logically now that it is determined following categorisation.
- Service discounts on associated services (Governance clerking and GDPR) can still be accessed using bespoke credit (up to £250 per service as previously). This has moved from the bespoke menu to the Sheffield System part of the core offer.
