Keeping our leeth healthy

Background information for teachers

Dental health is an important issue. Tooth decay affects children and families, despite it being preventable.

- Every 10 minutes a child in England has a rotten tooth removed.
- On average children miss 3 days of school as a result of dental issues.
- 31% of 12 year olds said they were embarrassed to smile or laugh because of their teeth and 21% said they had difficulty eating.
- 58% of children aged 12 reported that their daily life had been affected by problems with their teeth and mouth in the last three months.

Curriculum: Working scientifically

- Planning different types of scientific enquiries to answer questions
- Setting up simple practical enquiries, comparative and fair tests
- Using test results to make predictions to set up further comparative and fair tests

VACANCIES FOR CLERKS TO GOVERNORS

Would you like to be part of a busy and interesting team?

The Governance Improvement Service (now part of Learn Sheffield) are looking for individuals with an interest in education to work with the team.

The role of the clerk to governors is essential at governing board meetings in schools and academies in Sheffield. As well as providing procedural support and guidance during the meeting, clerks are key in ensuring that the meeting minutes capture examples of how governors have fulfilled their 3 main functions:

- 1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction.
- 2. Holding executive leaders to account for the educational performance of organisations and it's pupils and the performance management of staff.
- 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure it's money is well spent.

The minutes that a clerk to governors produces need to be clear and comprehensive and therefore experience of summarising meeting discussions is important.

The meetings often take place in the evenings and last on average 2 hours; the minutes need to be ready for checking by the Chair within 7 days.

The Talk: A play by Neela Doležalová

What do you wish you'd been taught (or not) about s*x and relationships?

Created from interviews with almost 100 people, #thetalkplay is about s^*x and relationships education (SRE) policy and practice in England. It features tales of first times and crossed lines, the education and awareness we wanted, needed, didn't get, or didn't like. From parents and teachers, inquisitive 11-year-olds and angry 15-yearolds. doctors and former education secretaries (including Ed Balls and Nicky Morgan), the show captures voices from people from their teens to their nineties. These very personal interviews form the content for a 50-minute play that will make you laugh, wince, and maybe cry.

Following the performance, a Q&A and panel discussion will further explore policy, practice and research relating to SRE, in the light of the forthcoming implementation of statutory RSE (relationships and s*x education) in England. Panel members all have established expertise in the field, including the playwright/producer Neela Doležalová, Steve Slack (CEO of Sheffieldbased charity SAYiT), and researchers Dr Eleanor Formby (Sheffield Hallam University), Professor Julia Hirst (Sheffield Hallam University) and Dr Jo Woodiwiss (University of Huddersfield).

The evening will provide an opportunity for panel and audience members to engage in lively discussion about how we all learn about s*x and relationships.
