Sarah has been in the early years sector for over 20 years in a variety of teaching, leadership and training roles. In addition to being a qualified early years teacher and trainer of adults, she holds an MA in Early Childhood Studies and has undertaken postgraduate training in Child, Adolescent and Family Mental Well-being.

Mel Shepherd

Mel has been working in education since 2009, when she completed her teaching degree, with a career rooted in Early Years. Over the years she has taken on a variety of roles including teaching, managing settings and leading on quality development.

0-5 SEND Team



We deliver support citywide and work closely with families, settings, schools and professionals in Education, Health and Care services to help meet the needs of children with complex needs.

Early Years Quality & Access Team

Our Early Years Quality and Access Team is comprised of passionate, dedicated and knowledgeable early years professionals. They work collaboratively with schools and private providers to support improvement, developing high-quality early years provision that promotes high standards of attainment in all areas of learning in the Foundation Stage.

Through combined expertise they plan and deliver comprehensive programmes of training, providing early years settings with access to training that supports the effective implementation of the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Statutory Framework and its processes. They can provide bespoke consultancy, working alongside early years teachers and leaders to audit, develop, implement and evaluate practice including support with producing action plans for improvement in the Foundation Stage.

Working across the authority they conduct termly briefings and network events, disseminating key messages from the sector. Alongside this, the team act as facilitators for moderation events, supporting schools to work together through networking, to ensure consistent and accurate assessment standards in relation to the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile.

As we are proud Educational Training Partners for Autism Education Trust (AET) we offer training to Early Years settings using accredited Good Autism Practice workshops. These workshops value the early stages a pupil may be working within and offers practical strategies and solutions for meeting need.

The Multi-Sensory Impairment Teacher plays a key role in supporting children with combined hearing and vision needs, offering expert advice, personalised strategies, and practical interventions. In addition to direct support, the service also provides training and guidance to settings, helping staff to create inclusive environments and effectively meet the needs of sensory-impaired learners.

Educational Psychologists

Educational Psychologists provide a service to children, young people and their families, as well as to settings in Sheffield. They help to find solutions to worries and concerns people might have about how children are developing, progressing or learning.

All our psychologists are fully qualified. They have a degree in psychology and have undergone post graduate training. Everyone has experience in working with children and young people. Assistant psychologists and trainee psychologists work under the supervision of educational psychologists.



Early Years Conference with Ben Kingston-Hughes

The Power of Play – A Journey to Glorious Behaviour

Number of places: 120

This insightful event explores two essential aspects of working with young children, **Play and Behaviour**. By understanding the simple **neuroscience** of both behaviour and play this fascinating session explores how the two concepts are inextricably linked, and shows how practitioners can use this knowledge to radically improve the **well-being** of their children.

Leading play specialist Ben Kingston-Hughes takes a deep dive into play, exploring the fascinating neuroscience behind this **crucial developmental process** and highlights common sense approaches to create rewarding and vibrant play opportunities for our children.

The session also explores the **vital role of the adult** in supporting and engaging in play and shows how play is a **fundamental building block for brain growth, emotional well-being, social development, life long health and even life expectancy**. Ben will highlight how positive playful interactions with nurturing and joyful adults can be **profoundly important** for our most vulnerable children and support them to be **behave positively and ultimately to thrive**.

We will explore the **fascinating world of behaviour** and how we need as adults to **fundamentally understand behaviour** in order to scaffold, model and support our children. The session examines exactly what children are trying to **communicate** with their behaviour and then promotes a **series of strategies** to help our children to make pro-social choices. There is no “one size fits all” approach to behaviour but by making the effort to understand our children’s behaviour and their motivations we can **tailor our responses** to each individual child and **support them as they grow**.

Session Aims

- highlight key elements of the neuroscience of play and its vital role in well-being
- explore the critical role of the adult in supporting play
- give concrete strategies for improving play
- explore the fundamental motivators behind children’s behaviour
- showcase the essential neuroscience of behaviour and how an understanding of this helps to fine tune our strategies for the individual child
- assess children’s needs and how this manifests in their behaviour – especially our more vulnerable children
- inspire and entertain learners to have a positive experience of training with real world theory and strategies that directly apply to practice.

0-5 SEND Team: Ordinarily Available Provision – Supporting you and your Early Years Setting

Number of places: 20 / 30

Course suitable for:

All early years practitioners, childminders, managers, SENCos, teachers, teaching assistants, year 1 teachers and leaders.

Description:

This newly developed training package provides early years professionals with a valuable insight into the wider support available from the 0-5 SEND team.

To achieve this, access to the right support, in the right place and at the right time is essential. Wherever children and young people live in Sheffield, we want them to have their additional learning needs met. For most children, attending their local setting with other children from their community is the best way to ensure this happens. To achieve this settings must have a core offer that meets the needs of all children, including those with SEND. This core offer is referred to as the Ordinarily Available Provision. It is the range of activities, opportunities and strategies that are offered as good basic practice to meet a range of additional needs without the need for a formal diagnosis or specialist support.

The session aims to outline the early years offer for all settings, including what to expect from the Portage team, practical ways to support children with SEND, and the use of helpful strategies and visuals.

It will also introduce offers from our partner agencies and guide practitioners on when to consider further assessments, helping ensure a consistent and informed approach to early intervention and support.

Attention Autism Programme: Two-day Training Course

This 2 day course equips attendees with the skills to set up and run the 4 Stage Attention Autism programme. The training focuses on the practical aspects of intervention, working in a team and offering an irresistible invitation to learn. The Attention Autism Programme targets the teaching of attention, communication and social interaction skills. Training is run applying the principles of the Attention Autism Programme throughout each day. There are demonstrations of the techniques in action, films of the work with children, practical hands-on experience for participants and ideas for activities. Behaviour and Big Feelings

Number of places:30

All early years practitioners, childminders, managers, SENCos, teachers, teaching assistants, year 1 teachers and leaders.

Description:

This online, 4 part course will empower you to respond to children's 'behaviour and big feelings' with confidence. We will explore the connection between behaviour and emotions in a meaningful way, considering:

- Causes and triggers that contribute to a child's dysregulation
- The impact of attachment, SEND and trauma on 'behaviour'
- Communication and teaching styles based in connection and co-regulation
- Effective responses to a variety of dysregulated behaviours including hitting, throwing and biting
- How to use your environment to de-escalate situations
- Activities and resources to help children learn about feelings and how to regulate them
- How to ensure an approach to behaviour and big feelings that is supportive and inclusive of neurodivergent children
- What 'self-control' really means and how to help children develop it

There will be sharing of information, lots of practical tips, and time for reflection and questions. Participants are welcome to bring any questions they may have relating to current 'real-life' challenges.

Building Confidence across your EYFS Programme

Number of places: 20

Course suitable for:

This training is aimed at those who are completely new to EYFS, returning after a break or in need of a refresher. It may also be beneficial to members of SLT who want to enhance their knowledge and understanding of the EYFS.

Description:

This four day training programme is a chance to explore the EYFS Statutory Framework, gain an insight into the 4 overarching principles and an awareness of the necessary pedagogy, values and practice pertinent to the Early Years Statutory Framework.

We will focus on the necessity for providing a stimulating and enabling environment which, in turn, empowers children to learn. Practitioners will also spend time during our final session exploring the role of the adult within the early years.

Practitioners will spend time exploring the role of the adult within the early years, discussing how practitioners facilitate, nurture and stimulate thinking, thus allowing children to feel safe, supported, and encouraged to explore. Following the training programme, optional in-house visits and mentor sessions will be available.

There will be a focus on the Early Years Foundation Stage Profile, examining the fundamentals of how to complete the profile, the importance of moderation and rules around exceptions and exemptions.

Business Planning for Success

Number of places: Unlimited

Course suitable for:

The Business Planning for Success Course is aimed at those with responsibility for the overall direction of Early Years and Childcare provision, as well as those considering setting up or extending their offer. For example, childminders, managers, leaders, owners, trustees, committee members, school governors and anyone else considering setting up or developing their provision in Early Years (or the out of school sector, including HAF providers, short breaks providers, leisure and recreation providers).

Description:

Sheffield have recognised the early years sector are facing many changes and a rethink of their business model is now necessary to support both sustainability, high quality and importantly an inclusive offer for all children.

The Course takes the trainee on a journey of reconsidering what it is they are aiming to do and how they weave inclusion throughout a business planning process. Business planning for inclusion also involves thinking about supply and demand in an area, and what percentage of children with SEND are actually likely to need additional support, as well as where responsibility for inclusion rests and how it can be successfully shared. A series of examples from our work with a wide range of other providers nationally will be shared throughout to keep the session “real”.

Day 1 – Planning for Play

Additional training includes:

- Introduction to Speak up for Sheffield Training – which is beneficial for all early years practitioners
- 'Curious Communicators' sessions aimed at parents and carers to extend learning into the home environment

Evaluation and Impact:

After programme completion, we return to your setting to observe practice and gather feedback this evaluation assesses the impact of the training on practitioner skills and children's language outcomes, ensuring continuous improvement and sustained success. In addition, we will facilitate a moderation opportunity in your setting primarily focusing on the moderation and professional discussion with keyworkers who have completed 2-year progress checks.

Statutory Progress Check at Age 2 and the Integrated Review

The Unique Child Project Series

The four projects

Behaviour Matters: Enhancing Self-regulation in Early Childhood through Relationship-based Practice, Curious Minds: Empowering Maths and STEAM, Nurturing our Youngest Children in the Early Years and The Wonder of Two-Year-Olds.
