

## Primary PE, School Sport & Physical Activity- Sheffield Case Study

Area of Focus	School Sport: Breakfast & Lunchtime Provision, Extra Curricular offer, Competitions and Events, Active at Home, Links to Community Provision/ Clubs, Leadership, Intra Competitions/ Challenges

### **Intent: What did you set out to achieve? Why was this needed?**

To ensure there is a broad enough range of sports offered outside school hours that will appeal to a wide range of children including those with SEN and children who are less active. This was needed after extensive research which suggested children had been less active over the past 18 months but also to provide younger children, particularly those in foundation stage, with an after-school club which is suitable for them.

### **Implementation: What did you do and how have you done this?**

We began working with Kickstarters Chesterfield who promote a love of reading whilst developing football/multi skills in young children between the ages of 3-7. The coaching sessions revolve around a favourite children's book which the children immerse themselves in and then take part in a variety of football activities linked to the story. Over the spring and summer term, we set up a FS2 and Y1 club for up to 15 children each which ran weekly.

### **Impact: What were the results and how did you know?**

Both the FS2 and Y1 club were fully booked in both the spring and summer term with 15 children in attendance in each year group, whilst there was a reserve list of children, who were prioritised for the summer term club. The philosophy of Kickstarters also linked perfectly with our whole school priorities of improving reading as well as the mental and physical wellbeing of our children.

### **3 Top Tips for Other Schools to Implement Something Similar?**

1. Consider how you can link your whole school priorities to physical activity.
2. Consider whether you are providing a range of after school clubs.
3. Consider whether you are providing something for everyone from FS2 to Y6.
